Section 1. Project Description, Purpose, Need, and Objectives.

This project is a new 3 lane roadway that will ultimately connect Interstate 40 at the Beckwith Road Interchange to US HWY 70, giving a direct path to help commuters to and from work, home and other areas thus taking traffic from other areas within Mt. Juliet. This project has been in the TIP since 2008 and is finally gaining traction. We expect this road to create a new vital area of workplaces, retail centers and living in our city. The Right-of-Way Acquisition has begun and we are nearing the buying and final engineering to go to bid in the near future. We think that the construction will take 12 to 18 months once begun.

Section 2. Benefits to Region and Local Community.

This area of Middle Tennessee is growing exponentially and requires that we grow to keep up with the pace. We are planning to make this area a fresh, new, and vital area for growth. We are making plans for zoning this area to make this a livable, prosperous, and sustainable growth area for the future. The Long-range plan for this area will include workspaces, mixed use development to include workspace, retail sales and shopping, as well as single and multi-family dwellings to create a small area community as well as entice other to come here to shop, play and worship. The intent is to make it also culturally diverse by making a connection to I-40 more easily obtained to get those wishing to, an easier method of transportation, without the traffic if they had to go through town. It also fits into the thinking of the 2035's Plan to create a regional area to help congestion of having to travel into urbanized areas to shop and live.

Section 3. Project Deliverables, Schedule, & Milestones.

This project has been designed and is now at the obtaining of Right-of-Ways. The next phase will be to update any plans that have been previously approved after ROW negotiations are completed. We would anticipate this happening by September 2013. After all

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drawings are completed and approved by TDOT, and the Federal Highway Administration, we would then go to bid on this project. We anticipate that by Spring of 2014, that the bid would be awarded and construction began by Summer of that same year. Our goal would be that construction would be completed no later than 12 to 18 months after the contractor is giving the notice to proceed.

Section 4. Budget Narrative.

We have included in the TIP 2014-17 budget 2 items that are carried over from the last TIP. PE monies that will be needed to update plans after ROW acquisitions have been negotiated. Also added are the actual cost of obtaining the ROW which will occur within the calendar year of 2013. We are anticipating the construction to begin in the FY 2014 and be completed in 2015; therefore we have broken up the construction monies in those two separate years. Matching funds will come from the General Fund and possibly a Bond Issue by the City. These funds or availability to procure these funds are shown within the budget of the city.
