Thank you for your letter of July 12, 2013 requesting funding through our Interchange Lighting Program. I am pleased to advise you that the department will provide 50 percent of the cost of installing lighting at the referenced location.

Our engineers have requested additional information regarding the proposed project in order to develop an accurate cost estimate. The city of Mt. Juliet will be contacted soon by one of our engineers. When an estimate is available, staff from our Office of Local Programs will send you a contract setting forth the responsibilities of each of our agencies.
