CONFERENCE DRIVE ENHANCEMENT PROJECT

Goodlettsville

Since the Conference Drive Enhancement Project was submitted the City of Goodlettsville has

received a Grant from the Tennessee Division of Forestry to purchase and plant trees in the

grass median along Conference Drive. The City has planted 70 yoshino cherry trees along this

route which is a first step to enhancing this corridor.

As you can see on the attached maps Conference Drive parallels I-65 and connects with the

Vietnam Veterans US386 at an interchange that provides access to the Rivergate Mall and

serves as the entrance to the city of Goodlettsville. From a business and economic benefit

Conference drive pride access to Dollar General Corporation which employees approximately

1200 employees. This corridor also contains medical and insurance offices along with motel

and various commercial developments. From a residential standpoint the Windsor Green

Development has not only single family homes but townhouses and two large apartment

complexes. This corridor is truly designed to be transit friendly by providing access to the many

services, including employment, shopping, medical and various commercial developments.
