Section 1. Project Description, Purpose, Need and Objectives

Description: Widen Walton Ferry Road from Imperial Boulevard to Main Street and align with Old Shackle Island

Road at Main Street (to eliminate current "off-set condition) and improve Old shackle Island Road

from Main Street to Volunteer Drive.

Purpose, Need, Objectives: The primary objective is to mitigate current congestion. Other objectives include mitigating

future congestion, supporting economic development, improving safety, increasing access to

multi-modal options (bike lanes), system preservation and improving efficiency.

Project History: This project is included in the current LRTP. This project is included in the current TIP, except that

construction funds are in reserve and are insufficient to cover the estimated cost. PE is complete. The City has paid \$1,154,766 for its 20% share of ROW. ROW is being purchased by TDOT. It is

expected that TDOT will issue a Notice To Proceed with Construction in October, 2013.

Intended Users: Intended users include residents of Walton Ferry Peninsula (south of Main Street) and the residential

area along Old Shackle Island Road (north of Main Street). Area business owners, employees and their customers will also use this route. Two elementary schools and one middle school will also

utilize this route.

Anticipated Number of Users: The roughly 20,000 residents of the Walton Ferry Peninsula as well as approximately 5,000

residents of the Old Shackle Island Road area plus the area businesses and their customers

(estimated at 10,000) make up the anticipated number of users of this route.

Expected Scope of Work: Widen existing Walton Ferry Road (south of Main) from 2 lanes to 3 (continuous and

dedicated left turn lanes). Align Walton Ferry Rd with Old Shackle Island Road at Main Street. This will eliminate the existing "dog-leg" intersection. Construct 5 lanes at the intersection with Main Street. Improve Old Shackle Island Road from Main Street northward to Volunteer Drive. Bike lanes will be included. Improve vertical alignment with the CSX Railroad. Curb, drainage and driveway ramps will also be included. The curbing will provide access control in areas where it is now lacking. Sidewalks and

crosswalks will also be provided.

Major Tasks, Activities: Major tasks include construction of this new roadway, including realignment of Walton

Ferry Road and Old Shackle Island Road at the Main Street intersection. (PE and

ROW/Utilities are being completed in FY 13.)

Final Deliverables/Products: Final deliverables include an aligned 3-lane Walton Ferry Road and Old Shackle Island Road

from Imperial Boulevard to Volunteer Drive with 5 lanes at the Main Street intersection.

Sidewalks and bike facilities will also be provided.

Section 2. Benefits

By eliminating the "dog-leg" condition of the busiest intersection in the City, congestion will be mitigated and safety and efficiency will be greatly improved. This intersection divides East Main from West Main. The extra cycle of the traffic signal, which is necessary to make this off-set intersection function, result in delays. These delays trickle down to all other signals on East and West Main. Synchronization of all other signals must be timed based on this intersection. Alignment of Walton Ferry with Old Shackle Island Road at Main Street will enable much better flow of traffic. This addresses the MPO's Guiding Principles of Livability, Sustainability and Prosperity.

This project addresses Regional Goals 1, 2, 4, 5 and 8 as well as Major Objectives 1, 2, 8, 9 and 10. This project is consistent with the Hendersonville Land Use and Transportation Plan.

Section 3. Schedule:

Oct, 2013 Receive Notice To Proceed from TDOT for Construction.

Nov, 2013-Dec, 2013 Advertise for Construction Bids and CEI.

Jan, 2014-Feb, 2014 Award Construction and CEI Contracts.

Mar, 2014-Feb, 2015 Complete Construction and closeout.

The project will be managed by the City's Public Works Department and Engineering Consultant. The construction contract and the CEI contract will include schedules with milestones and dates. One of the main criteria in choosing the engineering consultant will be performance and proven knowledge of TDOT requirements and track record in working with TDOT.

The City has successfully managed the following projects:

- 1. Indian Lake Boulevard at 386 Bridge widening, ramps, signals
- 2. New Shackle Island Road
- 3. Traffic Signal Upgrade
- 4. ARRA Projects

While the City experienced some difficulty in getting through the TDOT process, once a Notice To Proceed with construction was received, the projects were completed on time and within budget.

Section 4: Budget Narrative

PE and ROW will be completed in FY13. \$5,100,000 will be needed in the FY14-17 TIP in FY14 to complete this project. The City is requesting \$4,080,000 (80%) in U-STP Funds. \$504,724 of U-STP Funds are in the current TIP in Reserve. An additional \$3,575,276 is needed. The City proposes to move this amount from the City's Rockland Rd Project. These funds are available as a result of the City reducing the scope of the Rockland project.
