

Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities (5310)

Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities (5310) is a formula assistance program for the special needs of elderly individuals and individuals with disabilities. This grant seeks to reduce barriers to transportation services and expand the transportation mobility options available to people with disabilities beyond the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. This grant authorizes funding for public transportation capital projects planned, designed and carried out to meet the special needs of elderly individuals and individuals with disabilities.

The Program of Projects (POP) identifies the sub-recipients and projects for which the designated recipient is applying for financial assistance. This POP was submitted to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for approval of Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities projects in the Nashville MPO urbanized area. This POP includes a brief description, total projects costs and Federal share for each project, and the amount of funds required for planning and program administration.

Agency Description: The Metropolitan Transit Authority (MTA) was formed in 1973 for the purpose of stabilizing existing public transportation services and meeting other transportation needs of the citizens within Davidson County and visitors who visit the city and local areas. The Nashville MTA provides public transportation services to citizens and visitors within the Metropolitan Nashville area and is a component unit of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville & Davidson County.

Project Description:

Project: Route 43 - Hickory Hills

The major goals of the Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities grant funding program is to continue to provide additional tools to overcome existing transportation barriers that face aging Americans and Americans with disabilities. While both of these populations seek integration into the workforce and want to participate in society there is a lack of adequate public transportation to meet their needs. Route 43 – Hickory Hills has been funded by the Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities grant program (formerly New Freedoms) since its inception in the fall of 2012 providing better transit opportunities along the Dickerson Road corridor and Old Hickory Boulevard. Using the FY2018 bill rate the finance and scheduling department was able to calculate the annual cost of running the Route 10 Charlotte Evening and Weekend Service for the 2018 fiscal year.

The analysis of the cost is as follows:

At an hourly service rate of \$106.28 for Fiscal Year 2018, the Total Operating Cost for this service is approximately \$542,886. This number is derived from the total number of annual service hours (5,108.07) for this route trips. To stay in compliance with FTA's match requirements, costs for operating are broken down: 50% Federal Share, 25% State Match, 25% Agency Match. Therefore, broken down to be 50% Federal Share at \$271,443, 25% State Match at \$135,721, 25% Agency Match at \$135,722.

Agency Description: The Mission of the Tennessee Kidney Foundation is to improve the health and well-being of Tennesseans affected by kidney disease through education, prevention, treatment and promotion of organ donation. In December 1969 a small group of physicians, businessmen, patients and their family members held the first meeting of the Nashville chapter of the Tennessee Kidney Foundation. In November 1972, the Nashville chapter of the Tennessee Kidney Foundation received an affiliate charter from the National Kidney Foundation becoming the NKF of Middle Tennessee. December 31, 2009 the National Kidney Foundation of Middle Tennessee *merged* into the Tennessee Kidney Foundation. Transportation for their patients is the number one concern and need of their patients.

Project Description: Capital Mobility Management funds will be utilized to improve coordination among other agencies and providers for a target population of elderly and disabled individuals. TKF will also **provide transportation support assistance** to patients in the RTA/MTA service area to allow access to care. The Transportation Assistance Program has diversified funding among foundation grants, corporate gifts, individual gifts, and major gifts. TKF works every day to cultivate funding for the program with a long term vision of ever expanding the services. Fuel Cards that is provided to 41 patients/month -- patients who own vehicles but either cannot pay for gas themselves and/or live in counties without AccessRide; Public and Alternative Transportation (Franklin Trolley, MCHRA, SCATS) Provided to 19 patients/month. No monthly limit per patient; Provided to 5 patients/month for three trips a week.

Agency Description: After two years of intense research, stakeholder engagement, and program design, Council on Aging (COA) and the Senior Transportation Leadership Coalition (STLC), formed Senior Ride Nashville (SRN), a new 501(c)(3) nonprofit in May 2017 with the mission to provide affordable, assisted rides and transportation referrals for older Davidson County residents. SRN launched rider services in Bellevue on November 1, 2017 with plans to expand to a second service area in early 2018. SRN is working to increase capacity to ultimately provide services countywide.

Senior Ride Nashville strives to improve the quality of life for older adults in Davidson County by providing guidance on mobility options along with courteous and safe door-through-door volunteer transportation to those eligible for service, enabling them to maintain their independence and dignity, obtain essential services, and stay connected to the community. Senior Ride Nashville honors and supports older adults while creating valuable relationships between volunteer drivers and riders. It also serves as an important linkage to other services that senior adults may need through partnerships with multiple community organizations.

SRN brings together two of Nashville's greatest strengths - a growing and vibrant population of aging adults and a tradition of volunteerism and neighbors helping neighbors - creating a cost-effective solution to a critical community need. SRN taps into technology to match the need for a trip with the willingness of a volunteer. It offers a way to provide not only a ride, but caring assistance and personal connection. If other services are more appropriate, Senior Ride Nashville makes the referral in the easiest way possible.

Project Description:

SRN requested to utilize operating assistance in the total amount of \$238,143.00. This includes Salaries & Benefits for FT Executive Director, FT Program Manager, PT Development Director, PT Office Coordinator.

SRN requested to utilize capital assistance in the total amount of \$59,550.00. This amount includes laptops available for in-office volunteers; **Training Center Equipment** such as projector, screen, and a whiteboard for training. These will be portable so that trainings can be provided on-site or at partner locations. **Outdoor signage and installation** would insure that volunteers and other visitors can easily find the location; **Software**; and a **SRN Van that will be ADA accessible** and available for volunteer, staff member, and partner agency usage. The agency will use the van to assist with transportation of Rider with family members as well as field trip type of events for group events.
